And I've already traveled to Greece, for my friend Tériade, Tériade the publisher. I made the book. It'll come out in a year and a half. So I accepted.

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Marina Grey: A book of etchings.

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Marc Chagall: Colored lithographs. So I accepted the suggestion of Hirsch, the director of the Opera House, to do these ballets. And I love, let me say it again, I love Ravel. You can't refuse.

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Marina Grey: Since you are a poet yourself, I believe you have more or less paraphrased a famous verse, and that you find that the motions, colors, and sounds of Ravel converse with each other.

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Marc Chagall: Yes, the longer I live, the more I see that it isn't a question of the story in there, not of literature. It's just the colors, the sonority, the music, and the movement. That's all. If we succeed, that's a good thing. If not, I don't know.
